## PASTOR'S CORNER

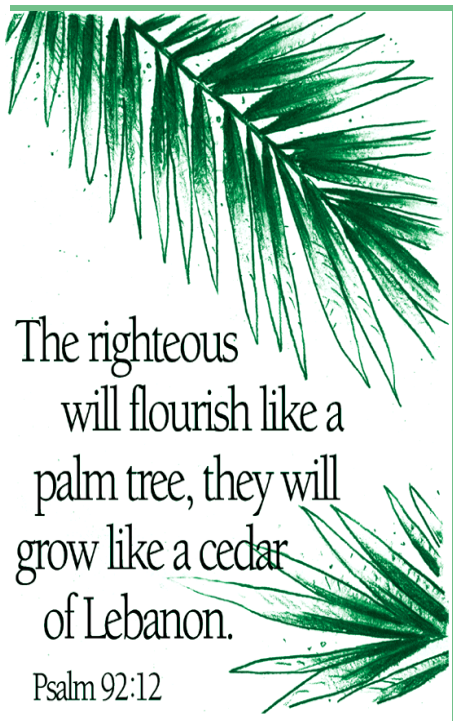
Being in the family of God is the best blessing one could ever receive. We have God as our Father, Jesus as our elder brother and each other as brothers and sisters in Christ.

## CPR TRAINING OFFERED

The Chicago Red Cross will provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training here on Saturday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, 8:30 A.M. to 2:30 P.M. CPR is a combination of rescue breathing and chest compressions delivered to victims in cardiac arrest. When cardiac arrest occurs, the heart stops pumping blood. CPR can support a small amount of blood flow to the heart and brain to "buy time" until normal heart function is restored. Participants will learn how to perform life saving CPR techniques and will receive a certificate valid for one year. The class is open to all Broadview members who are at least 11 years old. There will be a minimal fee to cover the cost of the workbook. A sign-up sheet will be posted. For more information contact Theresa Jackson at 708-547-4233.

## Palm Sunday...Why Palms?

Palm branches are mentioned in only one of the four Gospels (John 12:12-15). So why do we call the first day of Holy Week Palm Sunday?

Tradition plays an important part in church history. During Jesus' time, Rome was the world's leading power. Whenever the Romans were victorious in bat-

tle, citizens traditionally threw palm branches in the returning heroes' path. This was the accepted custom of reception. So when Jesus rode into Jerusalem, it was appropriate that He receive a hero's welcome. One week later, he would be victorious over death.

## GOOD NEWS CLUBS—TAKING THE GOSPEL TO THE SCHOOLS

On Friday afternoons when most kids race home to watch television, surf the Internet, play video games, or just hang out, kids in the Good News Club (GNC) at Sumner Elementary school are learning exciting Bible lessons that build moral character, singing songs, memorizing scripture, and playing games or other activities focused on the lesson's theme.

GNCs are on-campus after school clubs organized under Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) ministries. The clubs are one avenue CEF uses to take the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ to children who might not otherwise hear it. Working through CEF, Broadview Baptist Church leads two clubs, one at Sumner and one at Willa Cather Elementary School. Both schools are located on the Westside of Chicago.

The club at Sumner Elementary School is led by Sis. Jacqueline Kariem, a teacher at Sumner. She was recently joined by Sis. Debra Harvey, a retired Sumner Elementary School

teacher. The club at Cather Elementary School, is led by Sister Deborah Johnson; Sister Hattie King is the school's principal. Between the two clubs, over 50 kids have given their lives to Christ.



GNC leaders provide an invaluable outreach/missions function and they do not go it alone. CEF partners with churches and club leaders in establishing and maintaining clubs. The only thing needed to start a club is the desire to evangelize children for Christ.
